Who is the play for?

Written by Sarah Leaver through workshops and an R&D process with the young performers of ThirdSpace Theatre, *Earth Teeth* is a groundbreaking play which touches on the key issues young people face today.

It offers young people who might not usually see theatre as a window into a world of employment and enjoyment they might not have considered before.

It speaks about key issues for young people, including drugs, sex, the climate, and the feeling of being lost in a world that was not designed with them in mind.

The 75 minute play can be booked as a stand-alone piece performed by just the ThirdSpace cast or also including a chorus that can be sourced and developed from the local community if desired.

The performance can also be accompanied by bespoke workshops/discussions allowing audiences or service users to explore the many issues raised in a supportive and engaging way.

What is ThirdSpace Theatre?

ThirdSpace Theatre is an award-winning youth theatre led by nationally and internationally acclaimed director, Tanushka Marah, and enjoys an esteemed position in the Brighton Theatre scene, as well as being an associate company of Brighton Dome and Festival.

Across ThirdSpace's productions and weekly clubs and classes, children and young people create ambitious theatre that is rooted in their own experiences.

ThirdSpace's 2017 show Agamemnon won the Outstanding Theatre award in 2017 and the company has since performed and sold out venues across Brighton including at Brighton Dome, BOAT (Brighton Open Air Theatre), and ACCA. The outdoor site-specific shows BAKKHAI and Romeo & Juliet (staged in a skatepark) were huge hits during Brighton Festivals 2023 and 2022 respectively and have since been commissioned for future performances.

ThirdSpace co-creates work with its young people and through one-to-one mentoring has empowered and trained them to take up creative paid work experience and leadership roles. They are also supported to successfully apply to university, prepare audition pieces, and also to set up their own theatre companies. The company's work is youth-focused and responsive to the needs expressed by our young people.

Technical Requirements

Earth Teeth can be performed with a core cast of just 9 or can also be performed with a chorus. This chorus can be drawn from local communities with minimal rehearsal.

Playing space: minimum 5m wide x 4m

deep

Props and set: 3 tents, air bed, small

portable props

Lighting: minimal lighting rig acceptable, full design available in advance of performance. Pre-rig if

available

Sound: PA suitable for venue, onstage mixing needs to be wired in. Can use pre-recorded sound if necessary.

Get in: From 10am on day of

performance

Get out: 1 hour following performance

Cast age range: 16-25

Outdoor site-specific or indoor theatre space.

Outdoor site-specific locations particularly resonate with the content of the play and offer additional opportunities to utilise a large-scale community chorus.

Director

Tanushka Marah (she/her) is a theatre director and the Artistic Director of ThirdSpace Theatre CIC.

She also works as a Movement Director for companies such as the RSC, a dramaturg, writer and workshop leader. She was an Artist in Residence at Brighton Dome, and regularly works for Brighton People's Theatre, Shubbak Festival, Seenaryo, and more. After completing a degree in Philosophy her early career began by founding Company: Collisions which toured for ten years all across the UK and abroad. She has won two awards -The Genesis Young Director Award at the Young Vic and The Outstanding Theatre Award Brighton Fringe - and her work has been nominated for two other awards. Her production of Medea, toured international festivals in Cyprus and Albania, representing British Classical Theatre. Two of her original works appeared in London's International Mime Festival. Rest Upon The Wind sold out at Riverside Studios and Tristan Bates before touring extensively in the Middle East.

Writer

Sarah Leaver (she/they) has worked in theatre for 25 years as an actor, teacher, and youth director.

Sarah wrote and toured her solo show, *Memoirs of a Hermaphrodite*, from 2010. As an actor and deviser they have worked extensively with Company Collisions and Periplum Theatre, touring the UK and internationally. Sarah has taught, directed, and trained young adult actors for 15 years (Northbrook College, Institute for Creative Training, Academy Creative Training, Brighton). She has completed an MA in Creative Writing and received a Developing Your Creative Practice grant from Arts Council England to develop her writing for young adults. *Earth Teeth* is her first full cast play.
